

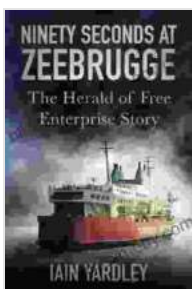
# The Herald of Free Enterprise Story: A Harrowing Tale of Tragedy and Loss

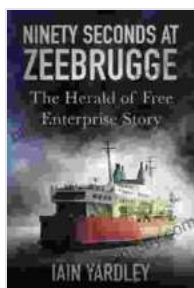

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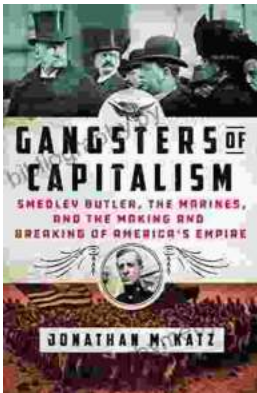
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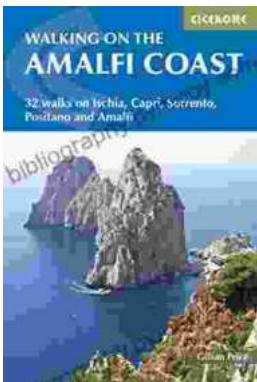
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
